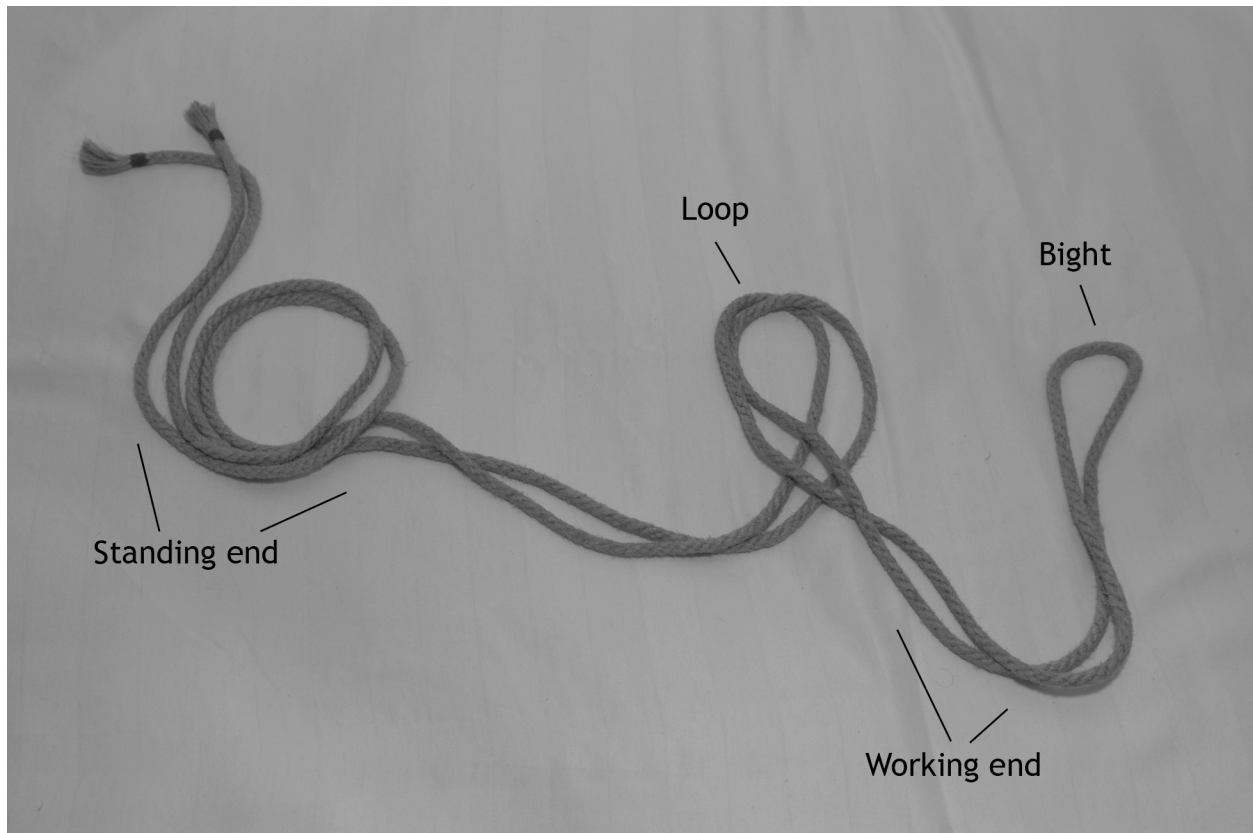
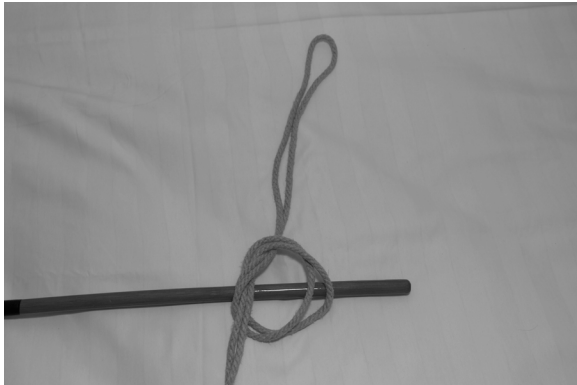


Parts of a rope



Eskimo Loop on a coil



make an overhand knot



wrap the bight around the limb and through the knot



continue to wrap limb



go through overhand knot each time



pull overhand knot tight

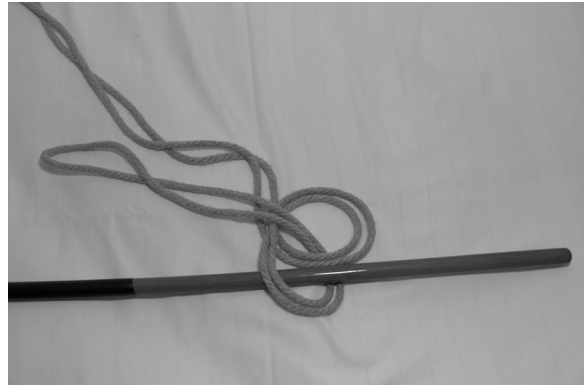


tie working end in half-hitch around standing end

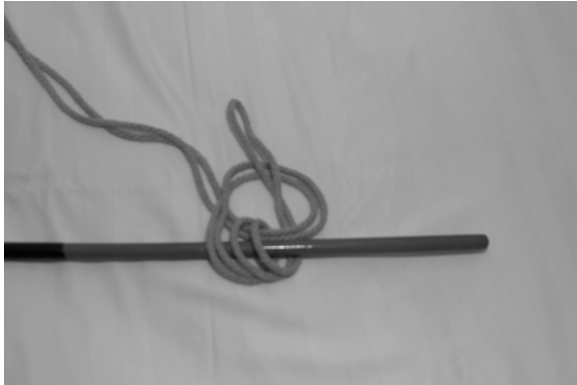
French Bowline (boh-lin)



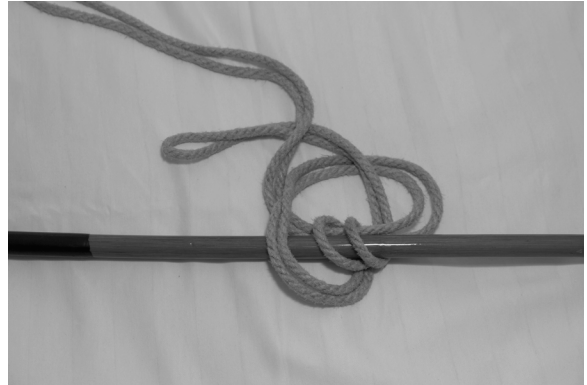
Make a loop in your rope

pass under standing end

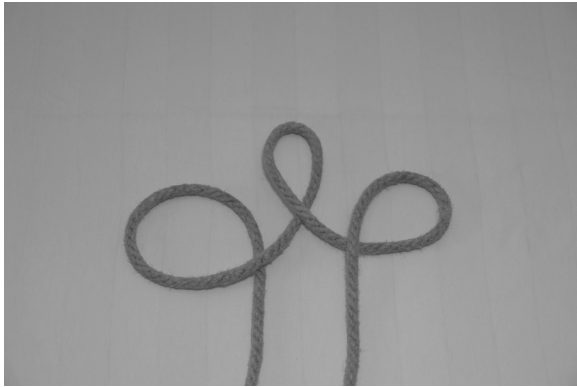


pass working end back through loop

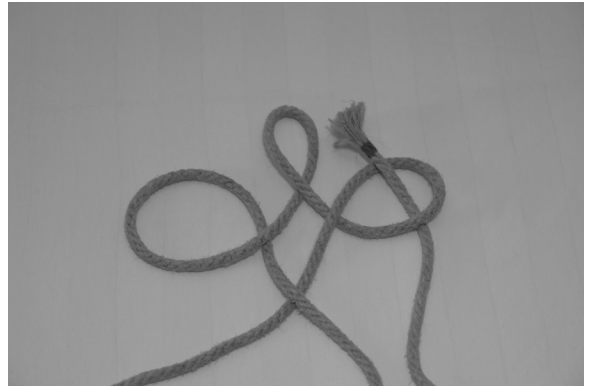


work knot tight and even

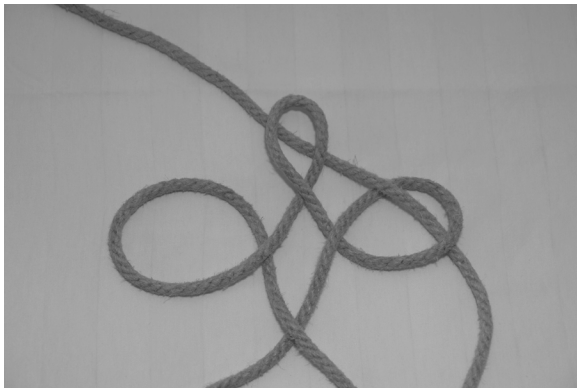
Mors du Cheval

turn the same way



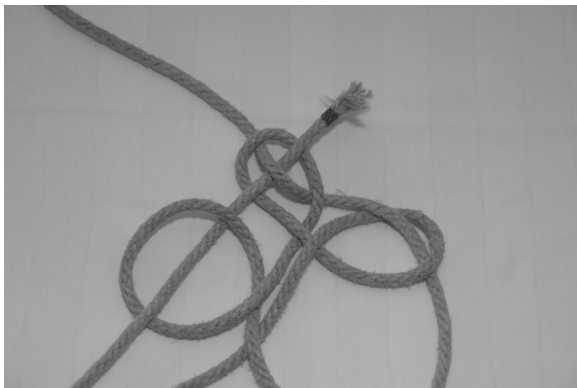
weave one end through



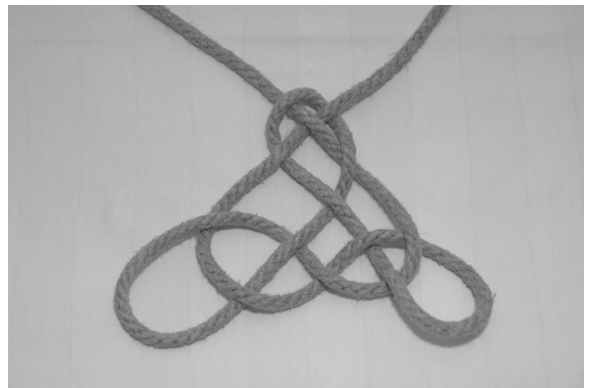
run it under the center loop



weave 2nd end through

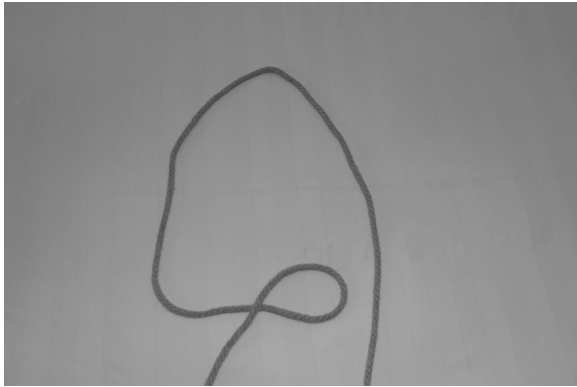


tuck end under 1st end and
back out of loop

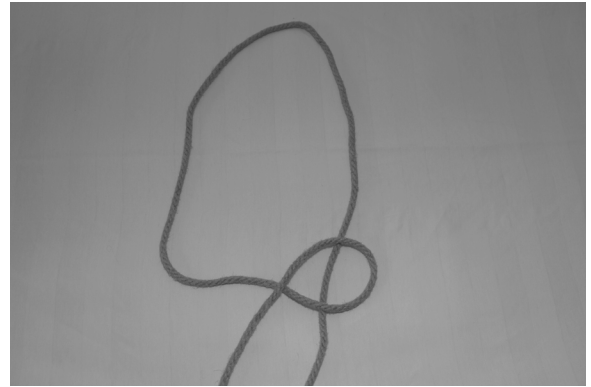


Pull ends to shape knot

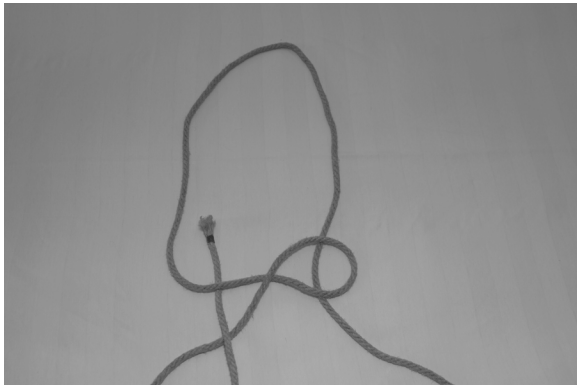
Chinese Double Coin Knot (Carrick bend)



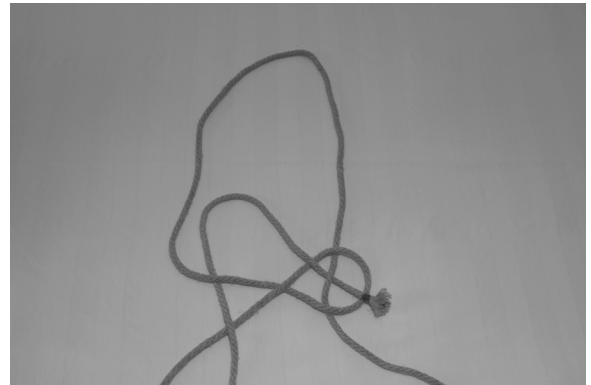
Make a loop in your rope



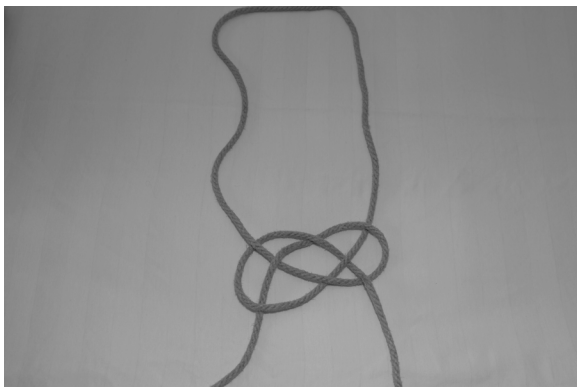
pass end under loop

and back through

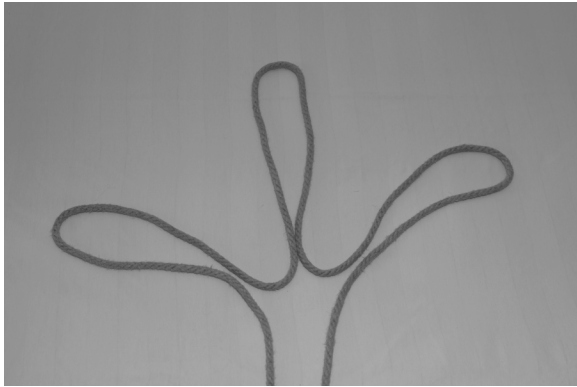


loose looks like this



pull firm to shape

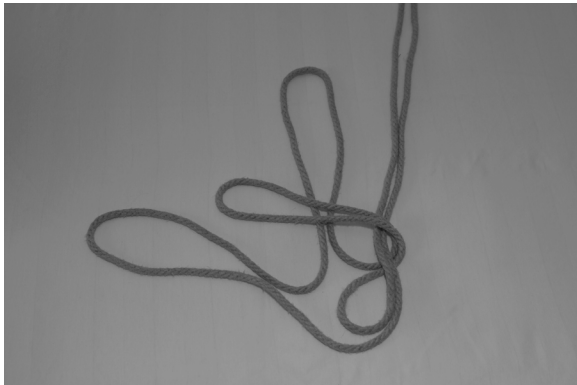
Half Chinese Good Luck Knot



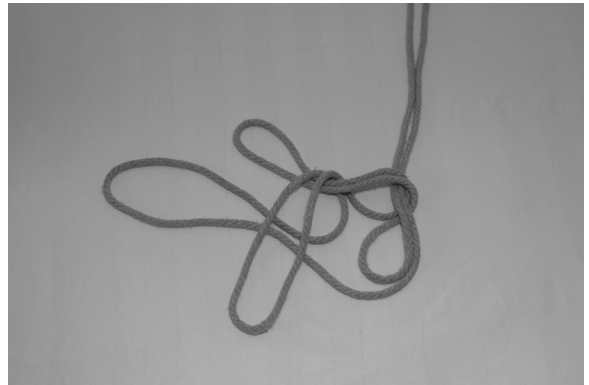
make 3 or more bights



fold ends over bight



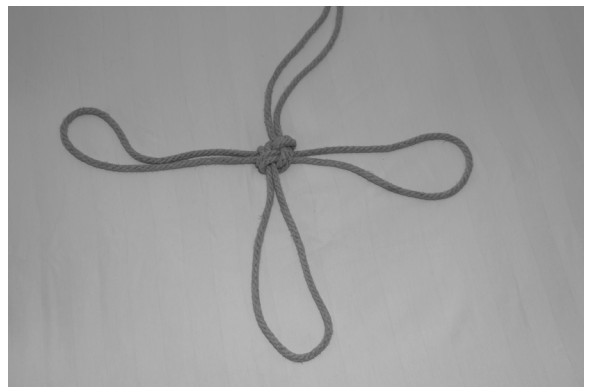
fold next bight over



continue folding bights

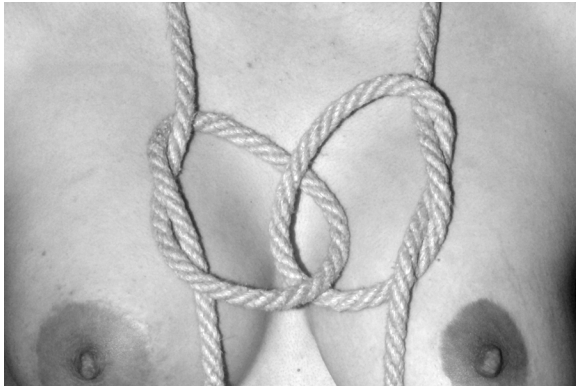


fold and tuck last bight

pull to shape

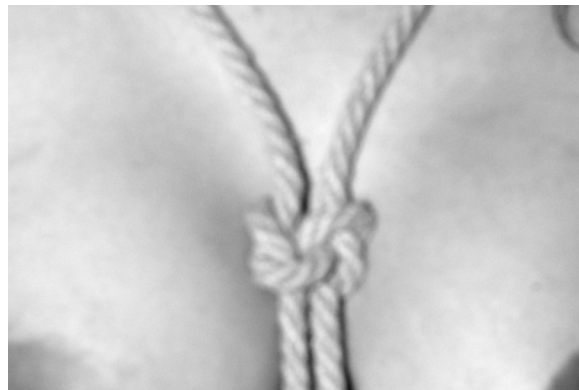
True Lovers Knot



Make two overhand knots
that intersect



pull the loops through



Square Knot



Make two alternating bights
draw the other end through
the top one and over the
bottom one



take the other end under
all the bights and back
over and through the
bottom bight.



Dress the knot as shown
